Her previous roles for Decadent Theatre Company include: Eden; There Are Little Kingdoms; The Thing About December and The Mai.



# David Harrower Playwright

David Harrower was born in Edinburgh in 1966. His first play, *Knives in Hens* (1997), was first produced at the Traverse Theatre, Edinburgh, in 1995. He is also the author of the plays *Kill the Old, Torture Their Young* (1998), and *The Chrysalids* (1999), adapted from John Wyndham's novel, for the National Theatre's Connections project. *Presence* (2001), his third original play, was first performed at the Royal Court Jerwood Theatre Upstairs in April 2001.

David Harrower has also adapted versions of Pirandello's *Six Characters in Search of an Author (Six Characters Looking for an Author)*, first staged at the Young Vic in 2000; Chekhov's *Ivanov* (2002), performed at the National Theatre in autumn 2002; and Buchner's *Woyzeck*, performed at the Edinburgh Lyceum in 2002. He has also translated *The Girl on the Sofa* (2002), a new play by Jon Fosse, presented in a joint production by the Edinburgh International Festival and the Schaubuhne, Berlin.

His play *Dark Earth* (2003), premiered at the Traverse in August 2003. He has also recently written a new version of Odon von Horvath's *Tales from the Vienna Woods* (2003) for the National Theatre, London, which opened in October 2003. He wrote an adaptation of Schiller's *Mary Stuart* (2006) and a new translation of Brecht's *The Good Soul of Szechuan* (2008). More recent work includes *Blackbird* (2005); *365*, presented at the Edinburgh International Festival in 2008 and telling the stories of 14 young people who move out of care; *Lucky Box* (2009) and *Ciara* (2013).

# Andrew Flynn Director

Andrew is the director of Theatre at Galway Arts Centre and the Artistic Director of Decadent Theatre Company. He also works as a freelance theatre director. Dani Gill is a literary curator, producer, writer and educator, based in the west of Ireland. She was the Director of Cúirt International Festival of Literature, Galway. During her time with Cúirt she successfully won three major European Project Awards: Read Me Live (2011); The Crossroads of European Literature (2013); Sharing the World (2015-2016).

> She also introduced a dedicated Outreach Programme to the festival and developed the youth programme through the creation of the Cúirt Labs. Dani has worked as a Creative Producer on live performances across literature, film, dance and theatre. In 2019 she produced Mirrors, a show featuring the work of Nicole Flattery and Jessica Traynor. She published her first collection of poems, After Love, with Salmon Poetry in April 2017. She also writes fiction, having just finished her debut novel, as well as reviews and occasional features for The Irish Times.

**Gerry Barnes** Gerry Barnes is the Executive Producer of Decadent Theatre Company. Gerry was Executive Director of Cork Opera House from 1989 to 2010 during a major expansion of its artistic programme. He oversaw the development of The Half Moon Theatre as well as a refurbished Opera House during the unfolding of the capital expenditure programme from 1993 to 2009. During his tenure Gerry worked with his Board of Directors to upgrade the artistic quality and range of a programme which included touring co-productions with Town Hall Theatre Galway directed by Andrew Flynn (The Lieutenant of Innismore, The Lonesome West, Juno and the Paycock). He has to date produced the Decadent Theatre national tours of A Skull in Connemara, The Pillowman, Vernon God Little, The Dead School, The Weir, Eden, The Thing About December and A Love Like That. Gerry has programmed and produced plays for the Cork Theatre Company, Storytellers Theatre Company, the Belltable Arts Centre, and Cork Midsummer Festival.
