Q & A with Andrew Flynn, Decadent Theatre Company Artistic Director

Andrew Flynn is Artistic Director of Decadent Theatre Company. One of Ireland's busiest creatives, he directed the Irish premiere of Martin McDonagh's *Hangmen* which just wrapped soldout runs in Dublin and Galway. Later in 2023 will see Andrew direct *Every Brilliant Thing* in the Galway International Arts Festival in July and Billy Roche's *As Such As We* in Nov/Dec in The Jerome Hynes Theatre in the National Opera House, Wexford.

How did you go about sourcing the theatre rights for From a Low and Quiet Sea and arrange for yourself and author Donal Ryan to adapt it?

From A Low and Quiet Sea began life as a novel. It is a brilliant work of fiction that came from Donal's imagination. A novel is a very different form of literature to a play. I was in awe of Donal's skill and talent from reading The Spinning Heart. Then I read *The Thing About December* and I fell in love with that book. I approached Donal about trying to adapt it for the stage and through the great work of Jarlath Tivnan and a brilliant cast, we staged *The Thing About December* in 2019. In 2020 the world stopped, and I approached Donal about adapting From a Low and Quiet Sea. The novel had wonderful characters and three separate stories, and I spent several months editing the book, trying to distil the novel into a dramatic text. Several workshops with great actors and Donal were facilitated where we challenged and tested the work. This continued in rehearsals, and we finally had a show in July 2022.

Given the four stories intertwining in the piece, I wonder how much were the cast involved in structuring the final work as it appears on stage?

The cast and actors were central to the process. The workshops and rehearsals were very collaborative and together we helped shape and edit the dramatic text.

In respect of designing the play, what were your considerations as a director?

The play Is all about the characters, their stories, and words. The design needed to be very simple, it needed to provide a space where the characters can exist but would never distract or take away from the play's language and words. In truth, this play goes back to the very essence of theatre. All you need is the actor, a space and the audience.

What is next for Decadent after this tour?

Following the tour Decadent will mount a production of a Duncan McMillan play at the Galway International Arts Festival in July. Then the company will embark on a winter production of *On Such as We* by Billy Roche.

Andrew Flynn and Donal Ryan were recipients of a 2021 Elevate bursary grant to adapt and workshop the script of *From a Low and Quiet Sea*. Denis Conway | John

Denis is delighted to work with Andrew Flynn again having recently played Harry in the Irish premiere of Martin McDonagh's *Hangmen*, directed by Andrew and produced by Gaiety Productions in association with Decadent Theatre Company. It was Denis' third role in a McDonagh play having previously played Coleman in *The Lonesome West* in Dublin and Donny in *The Lieutenant of Inishmore* in the West End. He recently filmed a Netflix TV series, Bodkin, and worked in the UK on Alone in Berlin, Glengarry Glen Ross, Wallenstein and Gloucester in *King Lear* at Chichester and New York.

Abbey Theatre highlights: Hugh in *Translations* and Hjalmar Ekdal in *The Wild Duck*.

Gate Theatre: The Irishman in *The Gigli Concert*; George in *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf*; Victor in *The Price*; Moss in *Glengarry Glen Ross*; Mitch in *A Streetcar Named Desire*; and Finbar in *The Weir*.

He was the original Dinny in *The Walworth Farce* and Dunne in *Penelope* (Enda Walsh) for Druid, both of which toured nationally and internationally.

As Artistic Director of Ouraboros he produced large scale tours of Brian Friel's *Making History* and *Translations*. *Making History* (playing Hugh O'Neill) marked the quatercentenary of the Flight of the Earls. This production toured throughout Ireland and subsequently through France, Belgium, Switzerland, and Italy, ending in O'Neill's death place in Rome. Denis also played Salieri in *Amadeus*, the title role in *Macbeth*, Ulysses in *Troilus and Cressida*, Hugh in *Mutabilite*, the title role in *Richard III* and Odysseus in *Myrmidons*.

Television includes: North Sea Connection, Blod 2, Sliced, Normal People, The Young Offenders, The Running Mate, Scúp, Tri Sceal, Single Handed, Bailout and Trial of the Century.

Film includes: Aisha, Sweetness in the Belly, End of Sentence, The Truth Commissioner, Brooklyn, Garage, The Wind that Shakes the Barley, Alexander, Intermission, I Went Down and Michael Collins.

Denis was awarded the Irish Times Theatre Award for Best Actor on two occasions: for Richard in *Richard III* and for The Irishman in *The Gigli Concert*. He was nominated for Best Supporting Actor for Mitch in A Streetcar Named Desire and the IFTA Best Actor award for *Running Mate*.

Denis is a board member of the Brian Friel Trust.



Aosaf Afzal | Farouk

Following a successful twenty-year scientific career – which, in 2006, included his being awarded an MBE in the UK's national honours for Services to Science – Aosaf ran away to join the theatre! He trained at London's Mountview Academy and received his MA in Acting and Performance in 2017. Since then he has toured extensively in the UK and Ireland. He was nominated for the Man Booker Prize in 2013 for his debut, *The Spinning Heart*, and again in 2018, for his fourth novel, *From A Low And Quiet Sea*. His work has been adapted for stage and screen and translated into over twenty languages. *The Spinning Heart* was voted Irish Book of the Decade in 2016 in a nationwide poll run by Dublin Book Festival. Donal lectures in Creative Writing at the University of Limerick. His latest novel, *The Queen of Dirt Island*, was published in August 2022 by Penguin Books.
